ITEM 3 – Receipt and Adoption of the 2022/23 Annual Report and Financial Statements

- 3.3 Financial Report – As Hayden was an apology due to work commitments, Cas presented the Financial Report

The Club had a solid year of income growth as was the cost of doing business for the Club. Reporting a \$49,423 operating profit, however after adding depreciation resulted in a net loss of \$34,603

Most revenue streams grew in comparison to the previous season by 9.1%

- Merchandise +27%
- Bar +24.7%
- Kiosk +10.6%

ITEM 7 – Appointment of Medical Officer and Legal Officer

- increase in venue hire by 13.5%.
- Carnival hosting increased by 26%
- Donations +43.5% due to participating in the SLSWA Giving Day

Expenditure also increased by 9%

- Employment casts increased 31.8% as we added to our workforce with fulltime employment of our Head of Coaching and Athlete Development and Communications employees
- Increase in bar contractors due to increase in venue hire functions 19.9%
- Administration costs reduced slight by 2.6% and Building and Utilities down by 10.1%
- Commercial expenses increased 146.2% due to painting of the hall and in unforeseen cost to replacing the kitchen cool room. Cleaning coast also increased due to no longer having caretakers on site

Director of Finance and Administration

The 2024 financial year was marked by continued adaptation and resilience, as we navigated various challenges to ensure the ongoing success and sustainability of Trigg Island SLSC. Despite the hurdles, our commitment to our members' best interests and the club's long-term wellbeing remained steadfast.

Income Growth and Net Loss: This year saw a mixed performance in income streams and operational expenses, resulting in a net loss of \$112,106, a significant increase compared to last year's net loss of \$34,735. This increase in net loss reflects the ongoing investment in our club's infrastructure, programs, and services amid a challenging economic landscape.

Revenue Performance: The total income decreased by 8.17% to \$734,148.

- **Commercial Revenue:** Total commercial revenue decreased by 10.37% to \$222,611. While merchandise and bar sales saw declines of 23.74% and 43.45% respectively, venue hire sales increased by 21.58%, and Bar Venue Hire Sales rose by 20.25%.
- **Membership Fees:** Membership fees grew by 7.36%, bringing in \$185,349.
- **Non-Commercial Income:** This category saw a decline of 13.58% to \$226,989. Sponsorship and donations fell by 21.62% and 43.50%, respectively. However, bank interest surged by 314.05%, reflecting a positive financial management strategy.
- **Grants:** Total grants decreased slightly by 0.84% to \$135,057. Administrative and community grants saw a 20.70% increase, while lifesaving grants dropped by 58.94%.
- **Club Events:** Income from club events dropped by 55.70% to \$15,750, primarily due to a significant reduction in the Broome Sunset Carnival revenue.

Total Expenses: The total expenditure increased by 7.33% to \$726,938.

- **Commercial Expenses:** Expenses in this category decreased by 22.61% to \$38,478, reflecting cost-saving measures and efficient management.
- **Non-Commercial Expenses:** These expenses saw a substantial decrease of 50.60% to \$29,603.
- **Affiliation and Membership Fees:** Slightly decreased by 3.78% to \$20,369.
- **Finance and Administration:** This area experienced an 18.97% increase in expenses, totalling \$395,237. This rise is attributed to increased wages for operational staff, asset purchases and higher consultancy fees.
- **Lifesaving and Education:** Costs in this segment rose by 8.32% to \$17,434, reflecting our continued investment in essential lifesaving equipment and education programs.
- **Surf Sports:** Expenditure in surf sports decreased by 17.92% to \$52,905, with significant reductions in costs associated with competitions and general expenses.
- **Nippers and Youth Programs:** Expenditures in nippers decreased by 9.40% to \$27,292, while youth program expenses saw a significant increase of 237.58% to \$16,130.
- **Equipment and Depreciation:** Total equipment costs increased by 40.16% to \$118,011, driven by higher depreciation and asset disposal costs.
- **Community Engagement:** Costs in this category rose by 50.63% to \$11,475, reflecting our ongoing commitment to community programs and contractor payments.

Cash Flow Statement explained

The cash flow statement on page 4 of the Financial Report shows the actual cash generated and spent by the club over the year, providing a clear picture of how cash is managed and ensuring we can meet our financial obligations. It highlights the sources of cash inflows and outflows, helping assess our financial health and operational efficiency.

Our statement of cash flows indicates that while we have effectively managed to secure funds from memberships, sponsorships, and grants, our operating activities resulted in a net cash outflow of \$27,033 this year, compared to an inflow of \$98,277 last year. This shift highlights increased payments to suppliers and employees, reflecting our investment in club operations and community programs. Additionally, cash used for investing activities, particularly the purchase of property, plant, and equipment, amounted to \$33,307. Although this indicates robust reinvestment into club infrastructure, it contributed to the overall decrease in our cash position from \$473,158 to \$412,818 by year-end. We can derive some key financial ratios to better understand the financial health and effectiveness of cash usage for Trigg Island SLSC.

Liquidity Ratios:

Current Ratio: Measures the club's ability to pay short-term obligations.

- $Current\ Ratio = Current\ Assets / Current\ Liabilities$
- Current Ratio (2024) = \$525,555 / \$83,919 = 6.26
- Current Ratio (2023) = \$513,933 / \$44,170 = 11.64

Analysis: The current ratio shows a strong liquidity position, although it has decreased from the previous year, indicating a higher proportion of current liabilities relative to current assets.

Profitability Ratios:

Net Profit Margin: Measures how much of each dollar earned is translated into profits.

- $Net\ Profit\ Margin = Net\ Profit / Revenue$
- Net Profit Margin (2024) = $-\$112,831 / \$734,148 = -15.37\%$
- Net Profit Margin (2023) = $-\$34,769 / \$799,008 = -4.35\%$

Analysis: The net profit margin has decreased, indicating that a larger portion of revenue is being consumed by expenses, leading to a higher net loss.

Efficiency Ratios:

Asset Turnover Ratio: Measures the efficiency of using assets to generate revenue.

- $Asset\ Turnover\ Ratio = Revenue / Total\ Assets$
- Asset Turnover Ratio (2024) = $\$734,148 / \$1,221,974 = 0.60$
- Asset Turnover Ratio (2023) = $\$799,008 / \$1,295,057 = 0.62$

Analysis: The slight decrease in the asset turnover ratio indicates a marginal reduction in the efficiency of using assets to generate revenue.

Solvency Ratios:

Debt to Equity Ratio: Measures the club's financial leverage.

- $Debt\ to\ Equity\ Ratio = Total\ Liabilities / Total\ Equity$
- Debt to Equity Ratio (2024) = $\$83,919 / \$1,138,056 = 0.074$
- Debt to Equity Ratio (2023) = $\$44,170 / \$1,250,887 = 0.035$

Analysis: The debt-to-equity ratio indicates low financial leverage, which means the club is not heavily reliant on debt financing. However, there is a slight increase from the previous year.

The financial ratios as above suggest that Trigg Island SLSC maintains a strong liquidity position and low financial leverage. However, there are challenges in profitability and efficiency, reflected in the decreased net profit margin and asset turnover ratio. The club continues to make significant investments in infrastructure and community programs, as evidenced by the cash outflows from operating and investing activities. These investments are essential for long-term growth but have impacted the short-term cash position. Moving forward, focusing on improving profitability and maintaining efficient use of assets will be crucial.

Conclusion

Despite a challenging year, we have continued to invest in the future of Trigg Island SLSC, focusing on member services, community engagement, and sustainable practices. Our efforts have been supported by a dedicated team of volunteers and staff who work tirelessly to ensure the smooth operation of our club.

We'd like to acknowledge and thank our operational team: Club Administrator Bronwyn Meldrum, Engagement, Community and Partnerships Coordinator Sam Starr, Communication & Content Manager Amber Merritt, and Head of Athlete Development and Coaching Andrew Mosel. Bronwyn has excelled in her continued management and front-of-house duties. Samantha has returned, securing additional funding and continuing community programs. Amber's innovative marketing strategies have boosted our visibility and engagement. Andrew's leadership has been key to our success in retaining the State Championships, achieving success at the Aussie Titles, hosting carnivals, and developing athletes. All we can say is watch this space.

Our thanks also to SLSWA, who provide a financial contribution to the club because of their fundraising initiatives and promotional support for Surf Sports, Lifesaving and Education initiatives. Additionally, the City of Stirling continues to provide our annual funding grant, for which the club is extremely grateful.

We'd like to offer our sincere gratitude to all the teams of volunteers whose work and support allow our proud club to continue delivering on our commitment to members. We would also like to personally thank and farewell the director who will be stepping down from the board, Kevin Duguid.

Kevin, who has been a valuable and dedicated member of the board showcased his commitment and support, alongside his availability to all members at any time, leaves a legacy filled with integrity and admiration. Kevin, thank you!

At Trigg, we play the infinite game. We protect every life and continue to develop inclusive communities. We will continue to recognise all our heroes because not every hero wears a cape. We will continue to invest in the front line of lifesaving, educations and surf sports.

Director of Lifesaving

Lifesaving and patrolling our beach are at the core of everything that we do as a community service organisation and sporting club.

It goes without saying that the communal effort involved in performing those patrols is no small task.

Under the season 23/24 service agreement with the City of Stirling we provided patrols for Trigg Beach from Saturday October 7th 2023 to Monday April 1st 2024 on weekends and public holidays, this year including the Easter long weekend. This amounted to 117 rostered patrols provided by 16 patrol teams and the voluntary AM patrols of Christmas day and New Year's Day.

In addition, we provided 4 Abalone patrols across the 4 abalone fishing season dates.

Prior to the commencement of patrols, we again allocated members to patrol teams as they re-enrolled or gained new qualifications with a view to maintaining consistency for patrol membership balanced against requests based on friendship and family groups. While we were not always to accommodate everyone's requests, on the whole, a balance was achieved. James and Bronwyn put in a lot of time initially to work out teams at the beginning of the season and the youth team were able to provide insight into the best groupings for new SRC award holders as the education team completed courses through the season. We also responded to a handful of requests for members to change patrols for various personal and work reasons.

Patrol Teams

This season we were fortunate in that the majority of patrol captains and vice captains continued in their roles providing stability to the lifesaving area.

We also welcomed some new Patrol Captains who were supported by experienced patrol teams and/or assisted by experienced patrol captains.

We were also fortunate to have former patrol captain Steve Glossup available as backup leader as well as acting to help new PCs find their feet where required. We are lucky to have a lot of diversity in our patrol leadership group with a spread of ages, gender and experience.

This season we formed a second carnival patrol to assist in reducing the availability conflict experienced by Surf Sports athletes. A second goal for this team is to provide an opportunity to build towards other first aid competition areas. Building this team is ongoing.

Voluntary attendance patrols

This year our calendar included a second voluntary attendance patrol on the morning of January 1st coined the "President's Patrol" captained by president Cas Ryan. The weather on New Year's Day turned out to be much more favourable than for the second team of volunteers on Christmas Day's volunteer patrol where Youth Lifesaver of the Year Bo Watters performed a board rescue at the Bluehole with limited support and in difficult conditions.

Special thanks to all those that attended both Christmas day AM patrols as well as the New Year's Day AM patrol.

Abalone

In addition to our standard beach patrols, Trigg contributed patrols to each of the four abalone season days.

The originally scheduled fishing day of February 3rd 2024 was cancelled by the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) after consultation with Surf Life Saving WA SLSWA and Recfishwest based on the high-risk Hazardous Surf Assessment and expected poor water visibility. A replacement date of March 9 2024 was added in its place.

Trigg Island SLSC provided up to 4 IRBs with drivers and crews, 2 x Jet skis with operators, land-based patrols, first aid capabilities and coordination in our zone which extended from Trigg Island to north of Bailey Street. Swanbourne Nedlands Surf Club again provided additional land-based personnel to this zone, extending our capabilities and experience.

Members gained valuable experience operating in and around the reefs to the north of Trigg Island.

John Rhatigan performed the roll of Land Zone coordinator and recruited members to assist with land-based activities.

Justin Meldrum assembled equipment and operators and crew for the water-based patrols.

SLSWA topped up our supplies of PPE in the form of booties and gloves where required for operations on the reefs and also provided more throw lines to assist in reef rescues. The state government funds SLSWA to provide water safety for the season days and Trigg Island SLSC received a share of that based on the resources that we provided.

Largely due to the benign weather conditions, our members were not required to perform any rescues and instead were able to focus on preventative actions and a handful of first aid cases.

Prior to the first abalone fishing date, the education and Powercraft teams organised a multi-agency water-based exercise with WA Water Police and Volunteer Marine Rescue boats. The exercise involved practising patient transfers from IRB and Jet ski Power craft to larger vessels followed by a simulated line search. Much was learned by all parties involved.

Equipment

Betty's Burgers provided a much-needed new shade tent for patrols to replace the existing tent. These tents take a battering from the harsh environment of the beach and Betty's Burgers' donation of the tent was very much appreciated.

Thanks to sponsor B&E Fire Protection, we were able to purchase new sets of binoculars as well 2 new rescue boards for use this season. Further pairs of used binoculars were provided by WA Water Police.

RWC

A roster operated across the season providing RWC support to the majority of morning patrols and some afternoon patrols. RWCs also operated in water safety roles for carnivals. We continue to have the use of 2 RWCs allowing us to provide multiple RWCs when required, for instance during abalone patrols where we were able to provide 2 RWCs with driver and crew in addition to multiple IRBs.

Patrol Statistics

In the 2023/24 season we provided 117 rostered patrols comprised of members amounting to 6387 hours which is on a par with previous years of similar length seasons. An additional 166.25 hours were provided as abalone patrols.

23 rescues were recorded this season, down from the previous seasons. IRBs and boards performed the majority of rescues with PWCs involved in the rest.

211 first aids were performed, up significantly from last season but mostly marine stings and minor cuts and abrasions. Fortunately, there were no drownings, no use of defibrillators and only 6 required ambulances. This points to the competency and timeliness of the rescues performed and water observation.

It is also noted that club members performed notable rescues out of normal patrol activities on at least 2 separate Wednesday afternoons when teams were training and conditions were particularly testing.

Of the 222 members who patrolled this season, 10% are Long Service or Life Members.

I'd like to take this opportunity to publicly thank everyone who contributed to this season.

Including my immediate team James, Justin and Dave.

All the patrol captains and vice captains

IRB drivers and crews - drivers in particular as they are regularly asked to undertake more than their fair share of the heavy lifting.

The ARTs and first aid volunteers

Director of Education

This season has been marked by exceptional results and accomplishments within the education portfolio. A variety of courses were delivered and we successfully reached individuals of all ages and skill levels, empowering them with the knowledge and confidence to stay safe and keep others safe in and near the ocean. From basic water safety to advanced rescue techniques, individuals have honed their abilities and are better prepared to respond effectively to emergencies in the aquatic environment.

We successfully introduced a unified e-Application Form. Members can now conveniently apply for all courses online via a single application form ensuring a hassle-free experience for both applicants and our education team. Looking ahead, we remain committed to leveraging digital solutions to further enhance the accessibility and effectiveness of our educational programs.

Attainment of the updated Silver Medallion Patrol Captain and Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue awards, including up to facilitator qualifications, will significantly enhance the capabilities and effectiveness of our patrol teams. These advanced awards serve as a vital component of our education pathway, providing members with a clear progression of learning and skill development.



Powercraft operators had the opportunity to train alongside WA Water Police and Volunteer Marine Rescue, learning advanced recovery and patient treatment techniques in preparation for their roles supporting Abalone patrols.

The annual skills maintenance program, commonly referred to as the "proficiency test," ensures that surf lifesavers possess the necessary skills and knowledge to perform their duties effectively. The education team dedicated a significant portion of effort to ensure all our members had opportunity to maintain their skills across all award categories. The comprehensive skills maintenance program introduced a 'twilight' session, expanding access opportunities for members with competing interests.

We have seen a large number of members gain new awards throughout the season. A number of courses were run prior to as well as during the season, with awards gained as follows:

With such a large squad with diverse ages, genders and abilities it's great to see the coaches work together to provide a program for all. With Todd's increased availability he really set up his coaching this season and has been rewarded by being named as a finalist for SLSWA Coach of the Year.

Thanks to Karl Smith for coaching our beach sprinters. The beachies had greater success winning multiple medals at Sates and Aussies. The beach is an area that we hope to grow and add to our competition competitive quiver. Thank you to Norman and Carol Gibbs for coaching the March teams. Their efforts resulted in two U/23 March past teams at States what won the gold and silver medals. Then the team went on to win back-to-back gold medals at Aussies. Norms efforts have also been recognised with him being named as a finalist for SLSWA Coach of the Year.

The club hosted or run 8 Surf Carnivals this season. This is easily the highest number of events of all the WA clubs and shows that we are the trusted club when it comes to hosting SLSWA events and Championships. A positive to having so many events at Trigg, is that it is a great advantage for our competitors to race on their home beach and they provide a good revenue stream for the club. There is a lot of work that goes into these carnivals and the work is done by our amazing volunteers who help with the set up and pack down. Thanks to any parent who picked up a star picket, set up or packed down a tent or set up a running track. It was also great to see athletes this season helping with the pack down of carnivals after they had finished competing for the day.

I would like to say a special thank you to Brian 'Boots' Campbell, Boots spends around 10 hours per day over a carnival weekend making sure everything is set up perfectly and runs smoothly. This makes our carnivals well attended and profitable for the club, his efforts cannot be overstated.

As in all areas of the Club, the Surf Sports division is trying to evolve to meet the requirements of its members where it can. This season we have purchased new oars, helmets, surf skis, vests and obtained new long boards. Ensuring that our athlete members are some the best looked after along our coast. At the end of this season, we surveyed some of athletes to see what we could do better and what we are doing well. This will give us some information to further improve Surf Sports.

Trigg Island had a huge contingency head over to the Sunshine Coast in Queensland for the Aussies and it was again another successful National Titles. This year at Maroochydore it provided challenging conditions and solid swell, our athletes relished that opportunity and took on the conditions. Our club combined medal count from the Australian Championships was 11 Gold, 11 Silver and 10 Bronze medals across the Youth, Masters and Open competition. With all areas contributing to the medal count it shows that we have great depth across the ages.

Many thanks to the Team Managers at Aussies. Norm Waldeck, who some of the younger athletes would have only just met, is a maestro of management. His efforts at Aussies often go unnoticed because things run so smoothly. Club Administrator, Bronwyn Meldrum ably assisted Norm as a manager to make sure all were entered, team changes submitted, craft arrived, uniforms fitted and the athletes kept updated with changing schedules. Thank you also to all the on-beach arena team managers, Mike Boisvert, Amanda Versace, Natalie Hawkes, Jenny Taylor, Emily Doddy, Paul Burton, Andrew Mosel, Ed Negus and Brad Headling. They all had the responsibility of their competition arenas, keeping across everything in their area and making sure everyone was at marshalling and happy.

We again won the Senior State Championships, Master State Championship, Surf Rescue Championship and the Board Riding Championship. The Senior State Championships was an extremely hard fight, only taking the lead on the last day of the competition. Our total point score of 871 is the highest point score that has ever been achieved under the combined points system. Since 1997 when Trigg Island won its first Senior State Championship, the club has now won every year apart from three times, when we came 2nd to City of Perth each of those years. Winning 24 of the last 27 years is a huge effort and something the whole club should be proud of and celebrate. Having sustained success over so many years is a very rare and special achievement.

With the announcement that there would only be one Western Suns State Team section event at Secret Harbour and with the likelihood of waves and a sand bank. We knew gaining experience in the condition was extremely important for selection. With many Trigg Island athletes wanting to make the team and setting it as one of their major goals for the year. The club planned 2 weekends of training at Secret Harbour, to pass on racing tips, surf skill practice and to familiarise everyone with the beach. The end result was that 14 athletes who were selected for the Western Suns Team and the Super Surf Teams League. This was the largest number of competitors from one club and there were also many other Trigg competitors who were very unlucky not to be selected.

Overall, this season Trigg Island had 18 athletes who were selected to represent WA as part of the Western Suns Surf State Team, Pool Rescue Team and the 2 WA Teams as part of the Super Surf Teams League, this is the highest representation of all the WA clubs. Dan Humble and Jaz Shipway - Carr were the captains of the Western Suns team and Jake Smith was captain of the Western Suns Pool Rescue Team.

We have two Trigg Island members Jake Smith and Harrison Hynes who are part of the Australian Lifesaving team, both have been selected for World Championships this September on the Gold Coast. The Australian Lifesaving team which is extremely hard team to make with only 6 positions available and for us to have two members in this team is fantastic. We wish Jake and Harrison good luck for the World Championships.

At the recent SLSWA Youth & Nipper Awards that recognise and celebrate the outstanding achievements the younger members, Trigg Island had many finalists and winners on the night. Oliver Browne (U/14) and Macy Boisvert (U/15) were their Surf Sports Age Champions. Indiah Reidy was a finalist for Youth Official of the Year and was named the winner of prestigious Youth of the Year Award. Oliver Browne, Billy Hawkes and Trent Yates were finalist for Youth Athlete of the Year with Trent being awarded the winner after his incredible season.

SLSWA have announced its finalists for the upcoming Awards of Excellence to recognise and celebrate the achievements of WA members throughout the season. For the Surf Sports awards, Trigg Island is very well represented with a finalists or multiple finalists in each category. The winners will be announced at the 2024 Awards Ceremony, Saturday, 15 June 2024. Each Winner of Surf Sports awards will go on to represent Western Australia at the annual SLSA Australia Awards of Excellence, which will be held in November. At the 2023 SLSA Awards of Excellence, Jake Smith was announced as the winner of SLSA Surf Sport Open Athlete of the Year. Congratulations Jake!

Director of Youth

The 2023/24 was an excellent season with a total of 133 youth members from U14 to U19 who patrolled, socialised, competed, and supported the Trigg SLS Club. The Youth program is supported by a network of people from the Club with special thanks to Jenny Taylor (Youth Development and SRC Manager) who has put in an amazing effort to organise the Youth Leadership Program, SRC Training and much more. 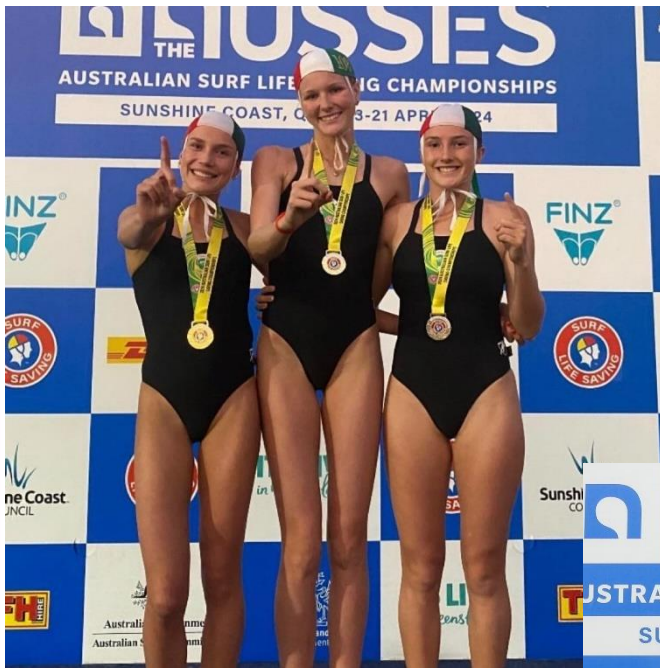

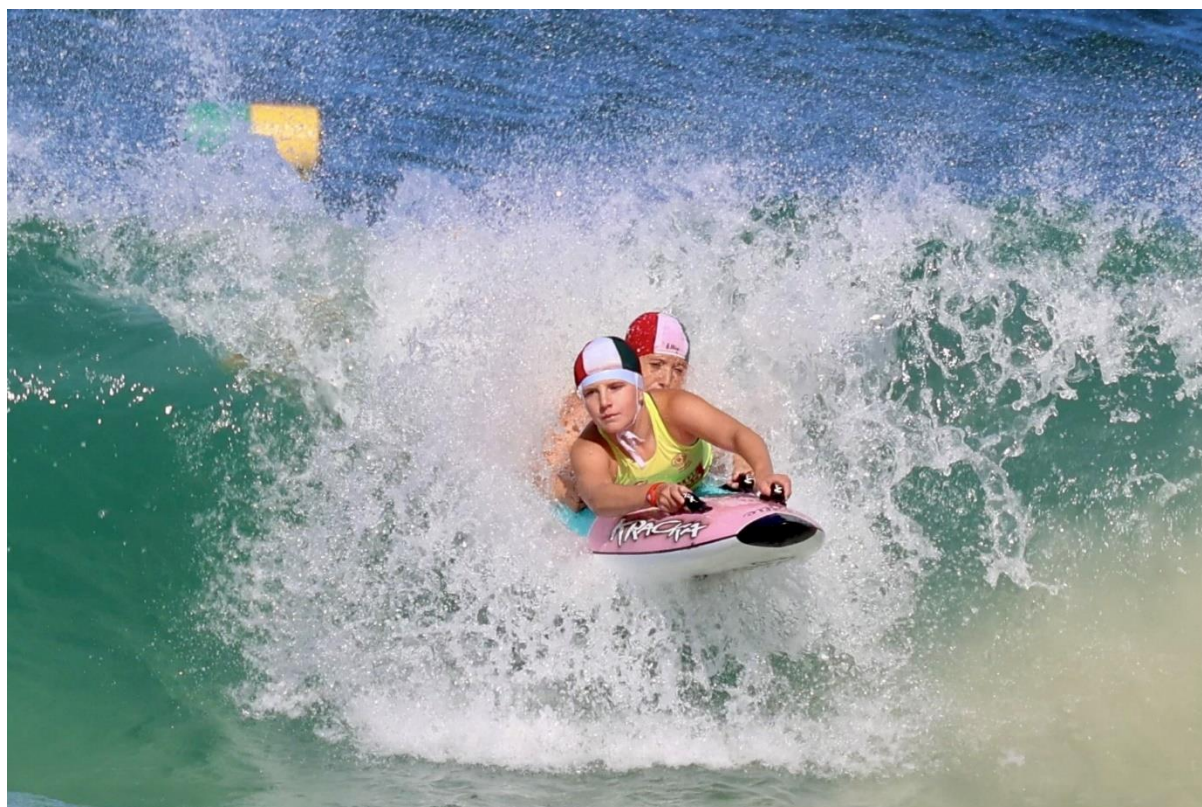



Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 April 2024

The financial statements cover Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Western Australia under the *Associations Incorporation Act (WA) 2015* ('the Act').

The principal activities of the Association for the year ended 30 April 2024 were:

- Provision of weekend patrols on our beach in delivering an essential lifesaving service;
- Provision of training courses to enhance the skills of our members; and
- Participate in Surf Sports events, locally, interstate and internationally.

The functional and presentation currency of Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc is

Australian dollars. The financial report was authorised for issue by the Committee of

Management on 10th June 2024. Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless

otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Regime and the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The accounting policies set out below have been consistently applied to all years presented.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(b) Leases

For any new contracts entered into on or after 1 January 2019, the Association considers whether a contract is, or contains a lease. A lease is defined as 'a contract, or part of a contract, that conveys the right to use an asset (the underlying asset) for a period of time in exchange for consideration'. To apply this definition the Association assesses whether the contract meets three key evaluations which are whether:

- the contract contains an identified asset, which is either explicitly identified in the contract or implicitly specified by being identified at the time the asset is made available to the Association
- the Association has the right to obtain substantially all of the economic benefits from use of the identified asset throughout the period of use, considering its rights within the defined scope of the contract

The Association has the right to direct the use of the identified asset throughout the period of use. The Association assess whether it has the right to direct 'how and for what purpose' the asset is used throughout the period of use.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(b) Leases (cont.)

At lease commencement date, the Association recognises a right-of-use asset and a lease liability on the balance sheet. The right-of-use asset is measured at cost, which is made up of the initial measurement of the lease liability, any initial direct costs incurred by the Association, an estimate of any costs to dismantle and remove the asset at the end of the lease, and any lease payments made in advance of the lease commencement date (net of any incentives received).

The Association depreciates the right-of-use assets on a straight-line basis from the lease commencement date to the earlier of the end of the useful life of the right-of-use asset or the end of the lease term.

The Association also assesses the right-of-use asset for impairment when such indicators exist.

At the commencement date, the Association measures the lease liability at the present value of the lease payments unpaid at that date, discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease if that rate is readily available or the Association's incremental borrowing rate.

Lease payments included in the measurement of the lease liability are made up of fixed payments (including in substance fixed), variable payments based on an index or rate, amounts expected to be payable under a residual value guarantee and payments arising from options reasonably certain to be exercised.

Subsequent to initial measurement, the liability will be reduced for payments made and increased for interest. It is remeasured to reflect any reassessment or modification, or if there are changes in in-substance fixed payments.

(c) Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Grant revenue

Grant revenue is recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

When grant revenue is received whereby the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt

(c) Revenue and other income (cont.)

Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for zero or a nominal value. These assets are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the statement of financial position, with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

Donations

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated, then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

The core principle of AASB 15 is that revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the Company expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services.

1. Revenue is recognised by applying a five-step model as follows:
2. Identify the contract with the customer
3. Identify the performance obligations
4. Determine the transaction price
5. Allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations

Recognise revenue as and when control of the performance obligations is transferred

(c) Revenue and other income

Gain on disposal of non-current assets

When a non-current asset is disposed, the gain or loss is calculated by comparing proceeds received with its carrying amount and is taken to profit or loss.

Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the Association is entitled to it.

(d) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset are capitalised as part of the cost of that asset.

All other borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

(e) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(f) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition, which is the deemed cost.

(g) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for nil or nominal consideration have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

(g) Property, plant and equipment

Where the cost model is used, the asset is carried at its cost less any accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses. Costs include purchase price, other directly attributable costs and the initial estimate of the costs of dismantling and restoring the asset, where applicable.

Assets measured using the revaluation model are carried at fair value at the revaluation date less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Revaluations are performed whenever there is a material movement in the value of an asset under the revaluation model.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the revaluation model. Motor vehicles are recognised at their net or trade in value.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Leased assets and leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or their estimated useful life.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

Fixed asset class	Depreciation rate
Furniture, Fixtures and Fittings	5% - 20%
Competition Equipment	10%-20%
Leasehold improvements	5% - 20%

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

(h) Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially using trade date accounting, i.e., on the date that the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

(h) Financial instruments

Financial assets are assigned to the different categories on initial recognition, depending on the characteristics of the instrument and its purpose. A financial instrument's category is relevant to the way it is measured and whether any resulting income and expenses are recognised in profit or loss or in other comprehensive income.

All income and expenses relating to financial assets are recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income in the 'finance income' or 'finance costs' line item respectively.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. They arise principally through the provision of goods and services to customers but also incorporate other types of contractual monetary assets.

After initial recognition these are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. Any change in their value is recognised in profit or loss.

The Association's trade and other receivables fall into this category of financial instruments.

Significant receivables are considered for impairment on an individual asset basis when they are past due at the reporting date or when objective evidence is received that a specific counterparty will default.

The amount of the impairment is the difference between the net carrying amount and the present value of the future expected cash flows associated with the impaired receivable.

In some circumstances, the Association renegotiates repayment terms with customers which may lead to changes in the timing of the payments, the Association does not necessarily consider the balance to be impaired, however assessment is made on a case-by-case basis.

Any gain or loss arising from derivative financial instruments is based on changes in fair value, which is determined by direct reference to active market transactions or using a valuation technique where no active market exists.

Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are classified as either financial liabilities 'at fair value through profit or losses or other financial liabilities depending on the purpose for which the liability was acquired. Although the Association uses derivative financial instruments in economic hedges of currency and interest rate risk, it does not hedge account for these transactions.

The Association's financial liabilities include borrowings, trade and other payables (including finance lease liabilities), which are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Impairment of financial assets

At the end of the reporting period the Association assesses whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset or group of financial assets is impaired.

(i) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Bank overdrafts also form part of cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows and are presented within current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

(j) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The directors make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key estimates - receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. No impairment exists in the current financial period.

Key estimates - inventory

Each item on inventory is reviewed on an annual basis to determine whether it is being carried at higher than its net realisable value. During the year, management have written down inventory based on best estimate of the net realisable value, although until the time that inventory is sold this is an estimate.
